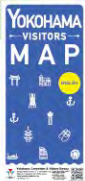

What to eat in Yokohama

As Yokohama has served as a gateway to the outside world, it is the birthplace of many Japanese dishes.

There is a diverse range of cuisines available in Yokohama.



Napolitan

Napolitan, The CAFE in the Hotel New Grand

This dish is said to have been created by the general chef of the Hotel New Grand in Yokohama. You can try the flavor of Napolitan that started in Yokohama and spread to the rest of Japan in the restaurant called, "The CAFE".



Sanmamen

This ramen dish was created by the successor to the founder of the well-established Chinese restaurant, Gyokusentei. Sanma in Chinese means "raw vegetables". The noodles are covered in stir-fried vegetables, like bean sprouts and cabbage, in a thickened sauce.

Janomeya's "Gyunabe Rosu (Loinj)"

Gyunabe (beef hotpot)

A flavor from when Japan westernized during the Meiji period! "Gyunabe," originated in Yokohama, is a dish in which meat and vegetables are placed into a pot and is simmered until the ingredients are cooked. "Ohtanawanoren," "Araiya," and "Janomeya" are well-established restaurants that are famous for gyunabe.



Bread

Yokohama has long accepted Western culture and is a battle ground for bakeries. There are numerous attractive bakeries in Yokohama, from stylish bakeries that bake fancy breads to bakeries that bake traditional breads.

1 The Yokohama Landmark Tower

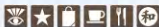

Standing 296 meters tall, this 70-story high-rise building is a symbolic Yokohama landmark. It is directly connected with Landmark Plaza. The view from the Sky Garden observatory on the 69th floor is breathtaking.

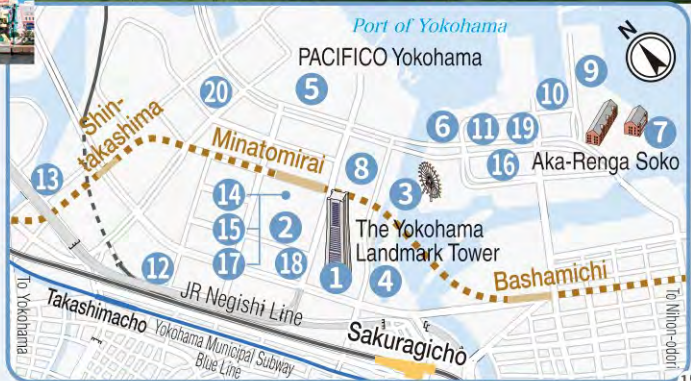

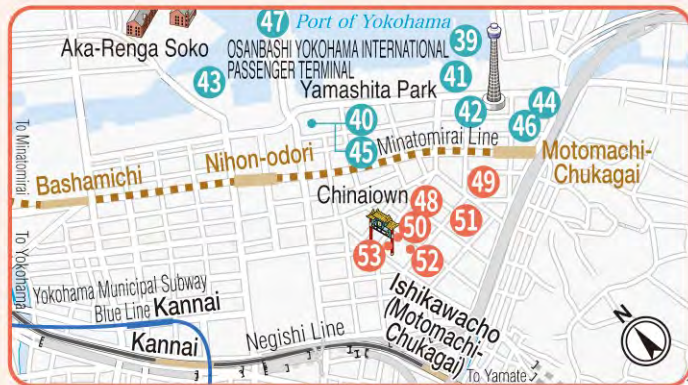
